

## How is Our School Development Plan Used?

- Guides ongoing assessment and review of goals and actions.
- Our school development plan is the driver for closing learning gaps and informs:
  - Instructional strategies
  - Professional learning
  - School structures and processes for learning
  - Resources to improve student learning
  - Data-informed decision making





## **School Development Plan – School Goal and Outcomes**

- To enhance learning excellence, we will improve assessment practices.
  - Improved summative assessment practices will build specific connections to the achievement of new curriculum outcomes in literacy and mathematics. This work will increase student learning excellence and teacher efficacy
  - Inclusive teaching and learning assessment practices that reflect diverse cultures and identities will increase student sense of belonging and learning excellence.

## **School Development Plan – Actions**

  - Writing: Co-create student-friendly language for the writing rope and exemplars
  - Mathematics: Create summative assessments using MathUP
- Well-Being Actions
  - Build on individual learner identity (reader, writer, mathematician, artist, ...) toward community identity (family culture, BRS, Canada)
  - Build explicit kind and caring routines to increase student connections with one another
- Truth & Reconciliation, Diversity and Inclusion Actions
  - Develop relationships with Indigenous elders to gain a deeper and more personal understanding of the path forward

#### **Our School Budget**

- Our school received \$4 138 519 in 2024-25 to provide a quality education to our students and meet the goals in our school development plan (SDP).
- At least 75 per cent of budgeted funds covers staffing and the remaining portion covers instructional and operational supplies.
- In our case, 95% of our budget is dedicated to staffing.

 Our student enrolment on September 30, 2024 was 641. Currently, we serve 674 students.

#### Our 2024-25 School Fees

Annually, we consult with families by outlining proposed activities for the upcoming year that may require a fee for cost recovery. The Buffalo Rubbing Stone Parent Association (BRSPA) has always subsidized the cost of these opportunities to reduce the cost for families.

- Field trips (not to exceed \$35 per student)
- Inline skating
- Swimming

#### Our 2024-25 School Fees

- 2023-24 Report to Parents on Fees is posted on our BRS website at https://buffalorubbingstone.cbe.ab.ca/school
- The deficit is a result of unpaid field trip fees. These costs remain in students' MyCBE accounts and are recovered over time. On February 25, 2025, only \$33.46 remained unpaid.


